Model Home Tour Checklist



Follow this checklist to make the most of your model home tour!

BEFORE THE TOUR:

Develop your wish list

Before touring a model home, you should develop a wish list.

- Outline the essential features you desire in your dream home and distinguish between non-ne-gotiables and desirable upgrades.
- Create a list of amenities you want within the surrounding community.

Pack your bag

While you won't need to pack an entire toolkit, there are some items you should take with you on a model home tour. Consider packing these items:

- Pen or pencil
- Notebook
- List of questions (or pdf guide)

- Camera (or smartphone)
- Tape measure
- Comfortable footwear

Formulate questions

Asking questions during your model home tour is a great way to gather more information to help you make an informed decision when the time comes. Here are the types of questions you should formulate

- What are the different floor plans you offer?
- What features does the home include?
- Are there any upgrade options?

- Do all homes come with a warranty?
- What is the financing process?
- What school district is the community in?

DURING THE TOUR:

Inspect the home

Quality of materials	Floor plan and style
Craftsmanship	Community

Ask questions

Don't be shy! Ask the questions you wrote down in the checklist's first step. Have you thought of more questions to ask during the tour? Ask them too! Write down the information you need to remember below.

Take pictures

Taking pictures during a model home tour may seem like an extra step, but it can be essential to help you review notable areas of the home after your tour. Here are some areas of a home you might photograph during a tour:

- Front yard
- Entranceway
- Living room
- Kitchen

- Bathrooms
- Bedrooms
- Basement
- Backyard

Review information and pictures

Now that you've had your model home tour, it's time to review! Write down what you liked and what you didn't like, and review the photographs you took of the home. At this stage, you may need to do more research on the property via the homebuilder's website or a good old-fashioned phone call to wrap up any lingering questions.
